HINTS AND TIPS

- Here's an idea for finishing UFO's.
 Make a numbered UFO list. Then get a friend or family member to pick a number. Finish that item from your list, then photograph and show it to your "UFO support group" members.
 Repeat the process as you knock items off your list!
- Make a hanging sleeve for your quilt out of leftover strips from the project.
 Then you will have fabric for a repair if it's ever necessary.
- Keep a pair of scissors tied to your ironing board so they're always handy for snipping threads.
- Use a small suction cup bath soap holder as a catch-all on the side of your sewing machine. Suction it on the side of your machine, and leave your seam ripper, small sewing scissors, extra bobbins, etc. in it.
- Try running the dull edge of a butter knife along a ruler to "indent" lines onto your fabric to use as a quilting guide instead of marking with a pencil or marker.

THE 30TH ANNIVERSARY CHALLENGE FOR THE QUILT SHOW 2011

The executive has decided on the challenge for the 30th anniversary of the Guild and the deadline will be next April in time for the Quilt Show. Final deadline to be published early next year. But we wanted everyone to have lots of time to plan their quilt. Since it's our 30th we decided the number 30 had to play an important part of the challenge. So have fun with it and be creative. We will have prizes for the top 3. This would be a great way to use up a charm pack since they typically have 40 fabrics all coordinated for you if you don't think you can do it on your own!

Here are the rules:

- it can be a circle or as many sides as you like BUT each side must be the same size and be either 30cm OR 30". So if you do a square it must be 30cm x 30cm or 30in x 30in. Or you can do a triangle with all 3 sides being 30cm or 30in. If you chose a circle it is the circumference that must be 30cm or 30in and unless you're into really miniature quilts a 30cm circumference is really small.
- It must be quilted in some way
- It may be embellished any way you choose but it is not necessary
- The edges must be finished in some way but not necessarily bound.
- You must provide a write-up explaining how your quilt meets the criteria.
- You must have a label on the back with your name and the name of the quilt.
- You can include any description with the quilt i.e. explaining your inspiration or ideas in making it
- Then you must incorporate 2 of the following (binding and backing don't count):
- it must have exactly 30 different
- it must have exactly 30 pieces
- it must have exactly 30 colors in the

- same color family
- it must have exactly 30 blocks
- it must be made entirely of 1930's fabrics
- it must have 1 piece of fabric from 30 different people (include the list of people with your quilt)


Layout version 1 – if you made block # 9 the 8 ½" block.

Finished size 40" x 40" with borders shown

As with the other version, place the blocks in a pleasing layout for your colors.

Sashing between blocks: $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 24 pieces Corner stones in sashing: $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 16 pieces Outer border: $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 4 pieces Outer corner stones: $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 4 pieces

Binding: $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – 4 possibly 5 strips



Layout version 2 – if you made block # 9 12 1/2"

Place the 8 blocks in a pleasing manner according to what looks best for your colors. The layout I've shown here is just a suggestion

Sashing around the 12 ½" block is cut:

- 1 ½" x 12 ½" 2 pieces. Sew to sides of block
- 1 ½" x 14 ½" 2 pieces. Sew to top and bottom of block

Sashing between the 8" blocks is cut: 3 ½" x 8 ½". Sew as shown. Leaving a large area not pieced will set off the blocks and give you more room for quilting.

Optionally, you could use your scraps and strip piece them together for the 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. For example strip piece 8 fabrics cut 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Add borders as desired. You would probably do borders at least 4"-6" wide.
