VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I mentioned in my VP Report last month, Quilter's Connection Magazine for Canadian quilters is just loaded with the latest quilting news and views.

From feature articles to projects, show and tell and great recipes, you'll find something interesting on every page. The Spring 2012 issue has a great article on having the right tools and I would like to share the information with all of you.

"To do a job properly you need to have the right tools"

A sewing machine in good working order.

- A rotary cutter and all that goes with it a good supply of new blades is just as important as the cutter.
- A good pair of fabric scissors.
- A good marker. A personal favourite is a white retractable pencil made by a French company – Bohn. It comes with a good supply of replaceable leads made from chalk and a little wax and includes a sharpener in the kit.
- A seam ripper. Several of them and always at the ready. A good choice is the Clover brand. It fits well in the hand and comes with a very sharp edge that easily cuts the threads and does not shred fabric.
- A reducing glass. The ones that were originally made to see people on the other side of the door works well, but one that is even more helpful is like a magnifying glass, in reverse. Stopping to look through this frequently, as you assess our work is invaluable.
- A well-fitting thimble. Leather, metal or the new small round self-adhesive ones all work well.
- A needle-threader. Clover's little two-ended threader is a good choice, but others work just as well.
- Good quality thread. This means Aurifil thread. If I could only buy one kind of thread, this is what I would get. One hundred percent long staple cotton, virtually lint free and because it is a very fine 50 weight thread, your quarter inch is guaranteed.
- Good quality fabric, and lots of it! Fabric is your raw material and nothing is so important as having on hand that which you will need as you go about creating your quilts.

Of course, the most important thing of all is not a notion, or a book or a workshop, or even the fabric; but a curious and adventurous spirit – a willingness to try something new and see what happens. It's quite the journey, this creative life, and having the right tools and the right frame of mind ensure that it will be a wonderful journey too.
