I would like to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, I will see some of you at the shop but others I won't see until after the holidays. The work shop with Joyce Gilmore on Colour Theory was a success. We had ten members attend. I would like to ask that you not sign up for workshops if you are only a maybe to attend, I read out 20 names at the meeting of members who had put their names down for attending the workshop on Nov. 20. 2012, at the end of the meeting we only had 8 people sign up. I called everyone who were not at the meeting and they all declined but I did have two extra members call and sign up. We were lucky to have Joyce to teach as she just charged us the teaching fee and did not charge for travel or accommodation. We hear from members that they want workshops but when we arrange for out of town or local teachers there is usually a very poor turn out. It is a lot of work to co-ordinate and plan these workshops for myself and for the teachers. We have a local teacher Doris Dungan to teach a 6 week intermediate quilt course which was requested by members, starting in January and so far we only have four people signed up for it so that will mean the course will be cancelled.
