COMFORT QUILTS

Comfort quilts come from members to be donated locally to the seniors homes, hospitals, Faye Peterson House, and other locations identified by the membership. If you have recommendations for some new places, please submit the suggestion to the Comfort Quilt Committee with information on the needs and contact information for the site. Our focus has been to provide quilts to locations where they will be used (repeatedly). Recently, many of the donated quilts were provided to make the long-term care beds opened at the former Lakehead Psychiatric Hospital feel more homelike

Dilico Family Services has been suggested as a location to donate comfort quilts for children removed from abusive or dysfunctional homes. This initiative would require participation by many members to fill the current need. Please consider this suggestion and identify any other facilities.

Recommended size for children quilts is no larger than 38-40x60. This size can be made using a meter of fleece as backing (no need for batting).

Hope that you have fun trying a new pattern or old one to make up a comfort quilt. Ask Pat for a label to identify the donation.

| Recommended Quilt Sizes | |
|--------------------------------|-------------------|
| Neo Natal | 36" x 36" |
| Crib | . 34 to 36" x 36" |
| Wheel Chair | 36" x 48" |
| Nap Quilt | 40" x 55-60" |
| Hospice/Bed | 63" x 80" |

Quilt sizes listed are guidelines based on what the Hospitals and facilities have identified. They suggested that it is better to have some extra width or length than be short.


