Greetings,

Seventeen Comfort Quilts were received at the October meeting, primarily from members who were headed south for the Winter. Big thanks to Jackie and Della for their contributions.

Six Comfort Quilts were received in November along with 2 receiving blankets. Some of the donated quilts did not have labels. Please see Pat or Wendy to get labels if you are working on some projects as this will help us out.

The Comfort Quilt Committee members met on October 27th to review the listing of places that quilts had been donated since records were kept for 1995. The Guild has a huge legacy in the community with 40 to 200 quilts donated each year (not including the Christmas Cheer Teddy Bear Quilts)

Quilts were taken to Faye Peterson House and provided to Precious Bundles. The Committee members are currently collecting information for some of the locations to update the sizes and types of quilts needed. We also are looking into a special project with the Alzheimer's groups in Thunder Bay and hope to have a prototype ready in time for the Quilt Bee so those interested can help create unique pieces that would be appreciated for those with special needs.
