CHANGE TO CONSTITUTION

It has been made clear over this year that we need to increase our membership fees in order to meet even the basic costs of running the Quilt Guild. The Executive has researched the issue and discovered that most guilds charge over \$40 for their memberships. Section 10 of our constitution currently reads:

"10. Fees:

Maria Bell

Annual membership fees will be \$25 if paid by the end of October meeting and \$30 for those renewing after the October meeting. If a person joins for the first time in March or later then the membership fee will be \$20 for the remainder of that fiscal year."

We would like to propose the following change to the Guild constitution, to be voted on at the May meeting: "All Guild membership fees shall increase by \$5 per year over the next three years to finish at \$40 starting in the 2019-2020 membership year:

2017-2018 - \$30 paid by October, \$35 if paid after October, \$25 if joined in March or later.

2018-2019 - \$35 paid by October, \$40 if paid after October, \$30 if joined in March or later.

2019-2020 and after - \$40 paid by October, \$45 if paid after October, \$35 if joined in March or later."


GUILD BOOTH MERCHANDISE

A big thank you to everyone who donated products for the Guild Booth. Now that all the bags are unpacked I can see there's so much wonderful stuff. If you're still making stuff then your last chance to hand it in is the April meeting (or make arrangements to get it to me before then if you won't be at that meeting). We will NOT accept anything handed in at the show; it's just too hard to control inventory that way.

We just finished pricing and organizing everything as I'm writing this. A few pics are included. A big thanks to my committee Elaine Bell, Fiona Lawrence, Darlene Yahn and Barb Mason for helping me do this. We priced for almost 3 hours tonight, which tells you there's a lot of stuff! To date we are just under \$2,700 of products and that doesn't include the books, magazines and patterns and a few things I hope to finish off. So come to the show with lots of money....it was hard for us not to shop tonight. We only take cash. We also don't want anyone offended at the prices we chose. We know the products are worth a lot more, but people coming to the show won't pay a reasonable retail price so the prices will seem cheap. But we also want to sell everything. We have tried to write a description on the back of the tag where there is some doubt what a product might be.

If you are donating books, magazines or patterns then please bring them Thursday morning when you drop off your quilts (i.e. before 9am). We are setting up the Guild Booth that morning. Do not bring them to the April meeting and please don't drop them off at Luci's shop.

If you have volunteered to work at the Guild booth just be aware that you must write a receipt for each item you sell and please try to write down what it is. We don't charge tax. The receipts should match the sold inventory at the end of the weekend. There will also be Guild merchandise (bags and pins) in the booth which we must keep track of since it's part of our assets and not the show merchandise that's been donated. We do not barter or make deals; prices are cheap enough. Sunday afternoon I'll reduce all the prices if we have stuff left.

There will be a master list with all products and their prices should a price tag go missing. We colour coded the price tags so everything of a same price is the same colour with the exception of 1 colour which was the generic one for the odd prices. 
QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE

COMFORT QUILTS

Greetings,


We received 17 comfort quilts at the March meeting. These will be kept until displayed at the Quilt Show then the Committee members will meet and distribute them to local facilities.

If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the recommended sizes are given here. Also, see me or Wendy for a Quilt Guild Label. A label is to be sewn onto the quilt – typically on the back bottom right side.

Please remember that the quilts receive frequent washings and should be stitched sufficiently to hold together. Most batting manufactures recommend stitching every 4-6 inches. To check, place your hand over the quilt. In all locations, your hand should be able to touch stitching that connects the quilt top to the backing.

Recommended Quilt Sizes		
Neo Natal	36" x 36"	
Crib	34 to 36" x 36"	
Wheel Chair	36" x 48"	
Nap Quilt	40" x 55 - 60"	
Hospice/Bed	63 to 65" x 80"	
Figit	24" x 30"
