

Greetings,

The Comfort Quilt Committee received 6 additional quilts in May and will meet on June 1 to sort the donated quilts for distribution.

If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the recommended sizes are given here. Also, see Pat or Wendy for a Quilt Guild Label. A label is to be sewn onto the quilt – typically on the back bottom right side or displayed on front. Thanks

Please remember that the quilts receive frequent washings and should be stitched sufficiently to hold together. Most batting manufactures recommend stitching every 4-6 inches as minimum.


Last year we collected over 120 quilted blocks that were squared to 12 ½ inch and incorporated into Hinge-Method quilts.

The method supplied more than 6 finished quilts and enabled the Guild to get larger bed-sized quilts. Participants had fun with the quilting of squares and the as-you-go process. Jackie Black has offered to organize the squares into projects if members are interested in making the blocks for a finishing Bee. If interested in making squares, please let me know at the June meeting. To simplify the co-ordination of squares for finished projects, we would recommend keeping to a simpler colour scheme with a neutral backing and remember that only cotton or cotton/poly batting should be used. Recommended colour scheme is blues, greens, reds, browns and oranges. These colours will work for men and women. Also, if you have suggestions – please let us know.

We are launching a new project for next year called "Hope House". We will be looking to donate bed and crib quilts for each room when they rebuild the facility after the fire

Dear Members of the Thunder Bay Quilters' Guild:

The Volunteer Association to Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Centre is a not-for-profit organization. We own and operate Season's Gift Shop. All profits from the shop, as well as from craft sales and any other small fund raising efforts are returned to the hospital annually. In addition, we support a number of annual scholarships and bursaries for our student volunteers, NOSM, Lakehead University & Con College nursing students, and nurses employed at TBRHSC.

In years past, the Volunteer Association has held Quilt Raffles as fundraisers. We have always relied on our volunteers to make the quilts. Unfortunately many of our quilters are no longer able to undertake larger sized quilting projects, and the last Quilt Raffle was held in 2010.

We would like to revive this highly successful raffle and thus we are seeking help from the larger quilting community. Potentially the raffle would be held in late November or early December, 2017 with tickets going on sale around September 1st. In the past, three bed-sized quilts were offered as prizes; we hope to raffle three quilts – queen, double and twin if possible. We hope to continue with that tradition.

The Volunteer Association will cover the cost of your materials (receipts must be provided); however we cannot cover the cost of labour. Alternatively, if you have a completed quilt that you would like to donate and you do not have receipts, there is the possibility that a charitable receipt for an "in-kind" donation can be provided.
