Center of Fanny Bay Star Medallion Quilt

A "Colour Blend Quilt" is a quilt made to look like the quilts of the early 1800's where attention was paid to colour but many small amount of fabric were used rather than having large amounts of yardage. Value was often ignored or lost due to fading or the scale of prints placed side by side. This old fashioned look is what draws many of us to the quilting world. Come and make your own family heirloom while learning simple piecing techniques and colour blend theory.

For all skill levels.

A month before the class Julie will consult with students via email about their fabric selections. Julie's sample is in paler colours but she asked us to let you know that you can use any colours you'd like (darks, brights etc) so don't worry if her choices aren't something that grab you.

May 20th - Botanical Free Motion Quilting Made Easy

\$90 or \$110 for non-members

Let's go organic with this class on free motion quilting designs from nature. Learn how to stitch a variety of fanciful leaves, vines, ferns and flowers. These designs look wonderful as a background or overall design on batiks, art quilts, children's quilts and more. Stitch them small with blending thread for a more traditional look or go big and playful with all your fancy threads.



Thread choice (colour, type and weight) to enhance design will be discussed as students stitch a small design sampler.


PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORT

This month we will be talking about how to mark your quilt. Everyone at one time wonders what we should use. Will it stay in during the quilting and will it wash out! Our guest speaker this month is Wendy Currie who has many years of professional quilting and is willing to share her expertise with us! I am including this link on the Frixion pens. This always causes a lot of conversation. But please make your own conclusion.

I contacted Karen McTavish and she said she uses the purple marker with the eraser for temporary marking and the blue one when she wants to mark a large quilt and then said you have to emerge the whole quilt to take the marks out. It you spray it, the marks will dissipate but come back! She also uses the white chalk pens. Matt Sparrow said he uses the white chalk pens but do not use the coloured chalk!

MYSTERY: Second clue:



Jeanette & Maria

12 inch block

For your two-color quilt select 2 fabrics, one in each color. For the purpose of these instructions, we will use red and cream.

Cut two 4-7/8 squares from each color for a total of four squares.





Match one square of each color, right sides together.



On the lighter fabric draw a diagonal line and sew a scant 1/4-inch on either side. Cut on the drawn line and press towards the darker fabric.

There will be a total of four half square triangle blocks.










Cut one 18 by 2-1/2 inch rectangles from each color. Sew the two fabric right side together on the long edge. Iron to the dark.

Sub cut the two color rectangle into 4-1/2 inch squares.



Cut one 4-1/2 inch square of the lighter fabric.

Assemble like a 9-patch



Different sizes of the Churn Dash Block

- 9-inch block cut 3-7/8 inches for the half square triangle blocks, cut rectangles 14 by 2 inch sub cut into 3-1/2 inch squares and 3-1/2 inches for the center.
- 6 inch block cut 2-7/8 inches for the half square triangle blocks, cut rectangles 10 by 1-1/2 inches sub cut into 2-1/2 inches squares and 2-1/2 inches for the center.
- 3 inch block cut 1-7/8 inches for the half square triangle blocks, cut rectangles 6 by 1 inch sub cut into 1-1/2 inches squares and 1-1/2 for the center.

The **Baggage Building Arts Centre** invites all Quilt Artists to submit for our 4th annual Quilt Exhibition. This is an open call to Thunder Bay and regional Quilt Artists to submit quilted items including small wall hangings to large bed quilts and everything in between.

Submission Deadline: Dec 15th, 2017

- Each person/group may submit multiple pieces, the pieces chosen will depend on space availability we will take at least one piece from each quilter/group
- Submissions including the following information may be sent email to bbac.angie@gmail.com
 - An image of the work
 - Quilter's Name/Names/Group Name
 - Contact email and phone #
 - Title or Name of the Quilt
 - Type of design/pattern/materials
 - Size
 - Price or "Not For Sale"
- Quilters will be notified by email on or before Dec 19th of the selected pieces

Details:

- The Exhibition will be curated and hung by the BBAC
- Each quilted piece must have a label pinned to the back of the quilt with the following info: Name/Title of the quilt, Type of quilt design, Quilter's Name, size, Price or not for sale.
- Quilts may be priced for sale or marked not for sale, the BBAC takes a 20% commission on all sales be sure to price accordingly
- All quilting must be finished and ready for display, please be sure the quilted work is clean, crease free and that all loose threads have been removed
- Quilts must be ready for hanging, this may be achieved by
 - having a 3" cotton pocket pinned to the back of the quilt along the top edge, the BBAC will supply the hanging rod
 - bringing the quilted piece with its own pocket & rod
