COMFORT QUILTS

Greetings,

We received 5 quilted squares, 4 Figit and 16 comfort quilts at the May meeting. Thank you.

We have been requested to talk about our quilts and quilting on June 20th at 2:30pm at Pinewood Court Seniors facility. If you can come out with some Show & Tell, please let Pat know. We have about 30 minutes for our session and questions. I expect that there will be lots of interest from residents (typically about 10 - 20 show up). This should be a fun time.

Have you thought about making a Figit Quilt? Florence and I could provide you some tactile fabrics and notions to give it a try. Let us know if you'd like some starter materials. Figit Quilts can be almost any size however, we recommend that they fit in your lap and have a Velcro tie end to fasten to the chair or wheel chair.


If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the suggested sizes are given here. Also, see me or Florence for a Quilt Guild Label.

A label is to be sewn onto the quilt – typically on the back bottom right side but you can choose where.

Recommended Quilt Sizes			
Neo Natal	36" x 36"		
Crib	34 to 36" x 36"		
Wheel Chair	36" x 48"		
Nap Quilt	40" x 55 - 60"		
Bed	63 to 65" x 80"		
Figit	24" x30"		

Please remember that the quilts receive frequent washings and should be stitched sufficiently to hold together. Most batting manufactures recommend stitching every 4-6 inches. To check, place your hand over the quilt. In all locations, your hand should be able to touch stitching that connects the quilt top to the backing.

NORTHCOTT QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE - SPRING HAS SPRUNG!

Well, spring 2018 certainly has sprung so there should be lots of inspiration for your Challenge quilts. Remember to work on your Challenge quilts over the summer! Keep in mind the rules:

- 1. The quilt must use the 3 challenge fabrics prominently on the front.
- 2. Only 3 other fabrics can be used on the front.
- 3. It must be no bigger than 36x36 inches.
- 4. Follow the theme "Spring is Sprung".
- 5. Hanging sleeve optional. We will be pinning through your quilt with basting pins to display it at the show.
- 6. Identification label or name on the back of the quilt only. Your name must not appear on the front of the quilt.
- 7. It must be quilted as a quilt sandwich with at least 2 layers.
- 8. Hand in at April 2019 meeting.

If you need more challenge fabric, please see Adrienne at the June meeting. Any remaining fabrics can be purchased if you feel you will need more to complete your quilt. \$5 for Fat Eighth Bundle.



Thunder Bay Quilters' Guild 2019 Quilt Show – Challenge

Following the fabulous success of our challenge for the 2017 Quilt Show, we present the 2019 Quilt Show Challenge:

Spring has Sprung!

Join your fellow guild members in celebrating the arrival of spring

Our quilt show in 2019 will be held when flowers are blooming and birds are happily nesting. The long winter will be over and the grass will be green. Help us to welcome spring by creating a challenge quilt to celebrate the arrival of spring in Thunder Bay. Northcott Fabrics has graciously donated 3 bolts of fabric for our challenge. These fabrics will be available to Challenge Participants at the March and April 2018 meetings. More details will follow but here are some highlights:

- 1. Create a wall hanging or quilt that can be hung. The quilt must be quilted.
- 2. Maximum dimensions 36" x 36".
- 3. Must use 3 fabrics provided in the front of the quilt, not including the binding.
- 4. The 3 challenge fabrics must be prominent in the quilt.
- 5. Only use up to 3 additional fabrics to create your original design.
- 6. Participants are encouraged to create an original design.
- 7. \$5 cash required to purchase a Fat Eighth Bundle. \$10 cash required to purchase a Fat Quarter Bundle.

There will be a limited number of Fat Quarter and Fat Eighth bundles brought to each meeting.

Bundles will ONLY be sold at the break. It will be on a first come, first served basis.
