
CHRISTMAS CHEER TEDDY BEAR COMMITTEE

COMFORT QUILTS

Greetings,

In September we received 21 comfort quilts and 10 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares. We will continue to collect the 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch quilted squares to be turned into comfort quilts. If anyone would like some supplies to make Figit quilts, please see Florence or Pat and please put on a Guild label.

Jackie Black has kindly constructed many comfort quilts using the Hinge Method and the Quilted Squares brought in during the past two years. Jackie has agreed to continue if there is interest by members so we will continue to challenge members to make

quilted 12.5-inch squares that can be used to make larger quilts. Please note that you can make any quilt square and then sandwich it with cotton or cotton/poly batting and a backing fabric to make a quilted square that should measure a minimum of 12.5 inches (so start with a 14 inch piece for backing and batting). Don't trim your blocks as they may fray so blocks should be trimmed just prior to making the quilt tops. Almost any colours can be used but we recommend using a neutral (beige, red, blue, brown, black & white) backing and would like colours that will appeal to both males and females.

If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the recommended sizes are given here. Also, see Pat or Florence for a Quilt Guild Label. A label is to be sewn onto the quilt – typically on the back bottom right side. Also remember that these quilts are washed frequently so stitching be every 4 to 6 inches. Thanks

QUILT SHOW - GUILD BOOTH

- Keep bagging up those scraps into Medium or Large ZipLock bags. The fabrics must be 100% good quilting cotton.
- If you have leftover balls of yarn you can bag them in ZipLock bags as well just label them indicating what type of yarn is there (eg 100% wool, 100% acrylic etc).
- I don't want these until the Thursday when you drop off your quilts. Same as the books, magazines and patterns. No cookbooks this time.

Keep making things for the booth. Nylon scrubbies definitely sold. No mug wrappers (we only sold 6 of the 80 we started with last time). Pot holders also did well, especially if they have the heat reflecting batting in them (label them if they do have this). I'll send Cathy patterns she can publish on the website or links to sites with patterns. But make anything you want. Bring it to a meeting and show people or send me a link and I'll include it in the next newsletter. I think the 'taggies' that Pat Inch showed us would be a good thing. I also think bibs might sell because many of attendees are mothers and grandmothers.

PROGRAM

I'd like to thank the 13 people who shared their first or early on quilts in September. Some of them looked really good to me and not like my first quilts.

October: Program: **Gadget Night.** I'll be showing you some of my favorite gadgets. Luci will demo some of the latest specialty rulers. I invite everyone to bring their favorite gadget and tell everyone why you love it. There's lots of new stuff out there and some people may not be aware of it...this could cause a buying spree or add it to your Santa list. Also bring one you've bought and found that it isn't all it was cracked up to be and tell us why you don't like it. I have a few participation prizes - some of my favorite gadgets.

November: technique demos and some ideas for Christmas.

December: Ugly Sweater Challenge. No, you don't have to go out and buy a sweater or even wear one, although you could. This is a 12" x 12" block that doesn't even have to be quilted but you may. Just embellish or fuse on fabrics to make your sweater. We'll have a vote for the viewer's choice of best ugly sweater - prizes for the top 3 vote getters. Remember ugly is in the eye of the beholder.

Remember to pickup the final part of the embellishment kit from me (I'll probably be in the library room). If you can't make the October meeting you can pick it up in November or make arrangements to get it from me. Be careful with this one because there are 2 needles in it (a #10 applique for sewing beads and #22 for embroidery - they're Bohin needles). There are also some extra beads I decided had to be in the finished wall-hanging. I also added a piece of lime green. I originally was going to use the white snowflake fabric for the

toque brim but I didn't like it. So I gave you a piece in the color I used but use whatever you like.

If the weather improves I will bring my sewing machine to demo how I applique, otherwise I'll just show you on paper. I'll also show you how to use Heat & Bond if you've never used it. I should be there by 6:15.

I didn't get many questions about part 1 so that's good or you haven't had time to do it yet. Part 2 is all about applique. I did Heat & Bond applique so remember, use a hot dry iron for only a few seconds. The shiny side of the H&B goes against the wrong side of the fabric. Let the piece cool before moving or removing the paper. If you fold over a corner or edge of the paper it will release easier. All pattern pieces are reversed already so that when you applique them they will be the right way.

Snowman 1 & 3 are cut from the larger of the cream fabric pieces. Snowman 2 from the smaller piece (white sparkly snowflake fabric).

You can use whatever colors you wish for the hats, they don't have to be the same as mine. I used some of the red snowflake binding fabric for the long toque and the black for the top hat. The house is brown and the roof and door the dark wine. I know some people don't know how to embroider or maybe don't want to. There is an embroidered tree in part 3, however, I included an optional pattern piece for a H&B appliqued tree which you can do instead (you use your own fabric for this). If you don't want a tree and want to add additional snowmen to match your family make-up then feel free to do so, it's your quilt.

The best foot for applique is a clear open toe (F2 for Janome and Elna). Second best would be any open toe or a clear closed toe. It's really hard to applique with a regular sewing foot because you can't see what you are doing. An open toe walking foot would work too.

You can just straight stitch about 1/8" from the edge but that only works if you have batik fabrics that won't fray easily. I always zigzag so my raw edge is enclosed. The settings I use is .6 length (so almost a satin stitch) and generally 2 width. Experiment with your machine's settings.

The applique patterns, picture after part 2 and examples of how to applique and the applique foot are attached. I won't have the actual piece at this meeting because mine is done and that would ruin the surprise. But feel free to take pictures in November.

November Part 3 is all the embroidery and embellishments. Remember if you bring it back finished in December you name goes into a draw for a special hanger I designed for it.

WINTER MYSTERY 2018 - PART 2

NOTE: Work needle down when doing applique. It makes it much easier. Go slow and pivot often.

- Trace all pattern pieces onto the Heat & Bond Lite (paper side). I leave about $\frac{1}{4}$ " $\frac{1}{2}$ " between pieces I'm tracing. Cut out about $\frac{1}{8}$ $\frac{1}{4}$ " outside your tracing lines. Fuse the H&B to the wrong side of the fabrics for all pieces. NOTE: I've given you some option toque patterns so use whichever you like. If you plan to applique a tree instead of embroidering it then also trace those pieces.
- Leave about 2 1/4" 2 1/2" on the right side for the tree if you plan to embroider it. Play with the layout of the snowmen and house until you like your layout. Just do the main pieces for now (snowmen, house & roof and optionally the tree). I do this on my ironing board so I don't have to move it.
- Take away snowman 2 and the roof
- Fuse down snowman 1 & 3 and the house.
- Zigzag all edges except the top of the house since the roof will cover it. I use matching thread or you can use good quality invisible. I actual use a Sulky white metallic for all my white snow parts (Lucy has a

- few spools at the Shoppe).
- Now add snowman 2, the roof, door and windows. Zigzag these. When you add a piece like the roof that covers another piece, make sure you overlap a teenie bit so you have no gaps.
- Now add the top hat and toque (but not the brim). You don't have to zigzag the bottom of the toque since the brim will cover it. Zigzag these. Then add the toque brim

I stitch down the pieces furthest to the back first and gradually work my way up. That way you don't have to stop and start your stitching as much and your thread ends get enclosed. That's why I don't fuse down all the pieces at once.


I do backstitch at the beginning and end if I'm not going to stitch back to the beginning of my stitches. When I stitched the snowmen I started at the neck and went around – it's easier to start at an edge that's like a corner. If you start at a curve and have to stitch back to meet up with it you might not get a smooth edge.


This is what it looks like after Part 2



Following the fabulous success of our challenge for the 2017 Quilt Show, we present the 2019 Quilt Show Challenge:

Spring has Sprung!

Join your fellow guild members in celebrating the arrival of spring

Our quilt show in 2019 will be held when flowers are blooming and birds are happily nesting. The long winter will be over and the grass will be green. Help us to welcome spring by creating a challenge quilt to celebrate the arrival of spring in Thunder Bay. Northcott Fabrics has graciously donated 3 bolts of fabric for our challenge. These fabrics will be available to Challenge Participants at the March and April 2018 meetings. More details will follow but here are some highlights:

- 1. Create a wall hanging or quilt that can be hung. The quilt must be quilted.
- 2. Maximum dimensions 36" x 36".
- 3. Must use 3 fabrics provided in the front of the quilt, not including the binding.
- 4. The 3 challenge fabrics must be prominent in the quilt.
- 5. Only use up to 3 additional fabrics to create your original design.
- 6. Participants are encouraged to create an original design.
- 7. \$5 cash required to purchase a Fat Eighth Bundle. \$10 cash required to purchase a Fat Quarter Bundle.

There will be a limited number of Fat Quarter and Fat Eighth bundles brought to each meeting.

Bundles will ONLY be sold at the break. It will be on a first come, first served basis.

QUILT SHOW WORKSHOPS WITH JENNIFER HOULDEN

Twisted Log Cabin May 24, 2019

9:30-4:00 doors open at 9am

This is a foundation piecing project which allows for accuracy and precision during sewing. The pieces are cut larger than needed so there will be some wastage of fabric. The paper acts as a stabilizer during sewing to help create the fine points in this pattern. Completed size is 36 by 36 inches.



Mini Bargello Sunflower May 25, 2019

9:30 - 4:00 doors open at 9am

Jennifer is very excited to teach you this technique of Bargello and applique. It is exciting to see it all come together and how each and every flower is different. Completed size is 20 by 20 inches.



The cost of the workshops will be \$100.00 for Guild members and \$120.00 for non-members. Limit of 20 per class.

Both workshops will require pre-class preparation! This will be mandatory so that Jennifer can get right into teaching her technique rather than using class time to cut the fabric pieces

Preparation is needed and must be done before class!

We are looking into having a workshop in order for all participants to be ready prior to the workshops with Jennifer. "No prep, no workshop, no refund".

Registration will be at the Guild Meeting in October.

Full payment must be made upon registration. Payment may be made by cash or cheque.

Kit list and class preparation will be given at this time.

We will have a date for the pre-class, possibly first part of April (to be announced)
