NORTHCOTT 2021 CHALLENGE

Superior Quilts 2021 has been cancelled due to that nasty virus called COVID-19 but the challenge is still going ahead!

Isn't this fabric gorgeous! How could you not want to sew something with it. The quilt committee has decided that even though the quilt show is cancelled the challenge can still proceed. The same basic rules (see below) will still apply however the submission date will change to a later date. More details to come re the submission date and location of display of challenge quilts. All the fat quarters have been purchased and at this time only fat eights are available for \$5 for a bundle of the three fabrics. Presently we are only selling one bundle per member but at the end of March if any fat eights are available extras can be purchased if required.

REFLECTIONS

What does 'reflections' mean to you? Could it be our unique aurora borealis with its blue and green colours shimmering across the night sky? Possibly you see a reflection in a mirror or pond. We are looking forward to seeing your creations!

Once again Northcott Fabrics has graciously provided 3 bolts of fabric for our challenge. Each bolt has been divided into fat quarters and fat eighths.

All the fat quarters have been purchased and there is a limited amount of fat eighths available. They will be sold on a first come, first serve basis. **Fat eights are available for \$5**. Payment for the challenge fabric will be **cash or etransfer only to Ellen Lang**. Contact Ellen Lang at 623-2307 or by email at ellen_lang@tbaytel.net if you are interested to arrange payment and coordinate pickup.

More details to follow but here are some highlights:

- 1. Create a wall hanging or quilt that can be hung. The quilt must be quilted & bound.
- 2. Maximum dimensions 36" x 36".
- 3. Must use all 3 challenge fabrics provided in the front of the quilt, not including the binding.
- 4. The 3 challenge fabrics must be prominent in the quilt.
- 5. Participants are encouraged to create an original design.
- 6. Only use 3 additional fabrics to create your original design.



APPS TO ADD TO YOUR PHONE OR TABLET





Instagram is great for sharing your own work, admiring the quilts of your friends, keeping up with favorite pattern and fabric designers, entering contests, and gathering inspiration.


Start by following your friends, practice using hashtags, and search for your favorite designers. Soon you'll being seeing all sorts of beautiful work in your feed.

Mary-Catharine's Sample Quilt

The blue and white sample quilt was created with a random selection of blue and white fabrics. It has a scrappy background with many different white and cream fabrics.

The multicolour sample quilt was created with a selection of fat quarters chosen to match a specific focus fabric. The background is Kona Navy.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS FOR THE 2020/2021 QAL

The Quilt will finish at 50x68 if you follow the pattern but we encourage you to feel free to play and have fun with the pattern.

Two colour options have been presented for the samples of this Quilt Along. The following describes the <u>approximate</u> fabric requirements.

Background Fabric(s) - 3 m (approximately - additional fabric recommended)

Optional - Feature Fabric(s) - select one or two feature fabrics and have at least one fat quarter (18" x 22" of each)

Complimentary Fabrics for the quilt blocks - range of colours and/or values - 18-20 different fat quarters (18" x 22" each) or equivalent (scraps work too!)



INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted & slightly cooled
- · 1/4 cup packed light or dark brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- I teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- · 6 Tablespoons pumpkin puree
- 1 & 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- I/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 & 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 3/4 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

DIRECTIONS

- I. Whisk the melted butter, brown sugar, and granulated sugar together in a medium bowl until no brown sugar lumps remain. Whisk in the vanilla and blotted pumpkin until smooth. Set aside.
- 2. Whisk the flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, and pumpkin pie spice together in a large bowl. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and mix. Fold in 1/2 cup semisweet chocolate chips. Cover the dough and chill for 30 minutes.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350°F (177°C). Line two large baking sheets with parchment paper or silicone baking mats.
- 4. Roll the dough into balls, about 1.5 Tablespoons of dough each.
 Using the back of a spoon, slightly flatten the tops of the dough balls
- 5. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until the edges appear set. The cookies will look very soft in the center. Remove from the oven. If you find that your cookies didn't spread much at all, flatten them out with the back of a spoon when you take them out of the oven.



BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP

INGREDIENTS

- 2 ½ pounds butternut squash, peeled, seeded, and cut into 2inch chunks (about 7 cups)
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 leek, white and light parts only, quartered lengthwise, sliced thin, and washed thoroughly (about 1 1/2 cups)
- · Salt and pepper
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- 1 2 cups water
- · 2 sprigs fresh thyme
- · 1 bay leaf
- · pinch cayenne pepper
- · Sour cream

PROCEDURE

- Place squash in bowl, cover, and microwave until paring knife glides easily through flesh, 14 to 18 minutes, stirring halfway through. Carefully transfer squash to colander set in bowl and drain for 5 minutes; reserve liquid.
- Melt butter in Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add squash, leek, and 1 teaspoon salt; cook, stirring occasionally, until squash pieces begin to break down and brown.
- Add broth, reserved squash liquid, 1 cup water, thyme sprigs, bay leaf, and cayenne. Simmer until leeks are fully tender, 6 to 7 minutes.
- Remove and discard bay leaf and thyme sprigs. Blend soup until smooth. Bring to simmer, thinning with up to 1 cup water to desired consistency. Season with salt and pepper to taste; serve with dollop of sour cream.

CHRISTMAS CHEER TEDDY BEAR COMMITTEE

As of now there is still no word about collecting Teddy Bears and their quilts for Christmas Cheer. As soon as I hear something I will have Joanne send out a notice. While we wait to hear about the collection would it be possible to let me know if you have a Quilt and Bear so that we can give them an approximate number.

I don't mind receiving emails from 103 people so that we have some idea of the numbers and Christmas Cheer can be prepared when that day comes. I am adding my email address so you don't have to look it up.

Just a reminder:

- No labels on the quilts.
- All tags to be removed from the stuffed animal. Even washing instructions are to be removed
- The quilt must be large enough to wrap up the stuffed animal.
- If you have a stuffed toy and don't want to make a quilt, then make a pillowcase for the child
- Dolls are also acceptable.

Thanks for helping to put a smile on a child's face on Christmas morning.

A huge shout out to all the quilters who brought us quilts and squares during the collections. It was so nice to see the eyeballs of your smiling faces. Hopefully we will be able to get together sometime in 2021. The quilts will be sorted and taken to local facilities.

We hope another collection will be scheduled later in November so one more distribution can happen prior to Christmas. If anyone has suggestions for the collections, please let us know. We did receive a great recommendation that more than one drop off location be arranged and will look into offering options for those who live further away.

Quilts collected prior to the lockdown were taken to Pinewood Court and the Regional hospital in advance of the church parking lot drops. Thanks to those who finished Quilt Bee projects, kits,

and their own donations we hope to be taking more comfort to additional facilities around town. It brings us joy to see the happy faces of staff and residents when the quilts are donated. They are always gratefully received and anyone visiting senior homes and hospitals usually can see the quilts many in use.

Jackie Black is making larger quilts again using quilted squares collected. If you have orphan blocks or want to try making a new quilt square, why not make up some 12 1/2" quilted squares. Just remember to use cotton fabrics, cotton or cotton/polyester batting and start with your backing and batting slightly larger (14"). Don't trim in advance. Jackie prefers to do this just prior to sewing to reduce fraying. We will be collecting squares during our tailgate events which will be scheduled when needed.

As always, the Comfort Quilt Committee welcomes suggestions for facilities that would benefit from receiving quilts. Our aim is to provide quilts where they will be repeatedly used and would provide comfort to those in the facility. We don't provide quilts for sale or by request although we do collect information on the needs (such as bed quilts for the children's ward). So far we have collected four of the ten needed at the hospital. Please provide some general information and a contact name with phone number for any suggested locations and the committee can consider adding to the list.

If anyone needs labels, let me know and we will figure how to pass the on. The general quilt sizes listed are guidelines only and sizes can vary. The key consideration is that there is sufficient quilting so the quilts hold up with frequent washes; typically every 4 to 6 inches or tighter if many small pieces.

Thanks to all who contributed quilts and to those working on more.

ORPHAN BLOCKS

Do you have orphan blocks? Why not finish them as quilted 12 1/2" blocks and try out a new quilting technique, practice free motion or walking foot patterns. Jackie Black has graciously agreed to continue making bed sized quilts with the quilted squares received using the hinge method.

Please use cotton fabrics only for backing and to make your quilt square. Backing pieces and batting should be oversized (14") and squares should not be trimmed after quilting. Jackie prefers to do this to reduce fraying. Batting should be cotton or cotton/polyester mix for consistency. All colours and patterns are welcome but consider that these quilts are used by male and female residents so a variety is appreciated.

Bring your quilted squares to the Comfort Quilt Collection Days and I will get them dropped off. No Teddy Bear Quilts are being collected at this time so please hang onto those. More dates will be arranged, as needed so it isn't too late to work on quilted squares for the next collection.
