
PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Are you afraid to quilt your own quilts because free motion quilting is hard to master, and you have tension problems? Then come and try walking foot quilting. With walking foot quilting your machine controls the tension so it's a great starting place. There are a lot of patterns you can do with this method to make your quilts look great.

We will be stitching on practice samples not an actual quilt so no worries. I will show approximately 10 different patterns and variations on each. There will be ideas for quilting borders, HST's, patchwork blocks and all over quilting. If time permits, we can also try adding some simple FMQ designs between walking foot quilting lines for those who know how to FMQ.

Since I can't do the demonstrations in person like I usually do, I will record them and play the videos during the class. Then you will practice for a while. There are handouts to accompany the class. This will be the first zoom class I teach so this will be a new experience on the teaching side.

If you have any questions, feel free to email me and I'll try to answer them. Once Laura determines there is enough people signed up to hold the class, I will send out the supply list and pre-class preparation. There is approximately 1 hour preparation for the class to get your practice sandwiches ready.

NORTHCOTT 2021 CHALLENGE

I hope you are all working at finishing your challenge quilts so we have a beautiful wall to display at the Thunder Bay Museum. In case you are short on your challenge fabric I still have some fat eighths left. They can be purchased for \$5. Payment will be cash or etransfer only to Ellen Lang. You can call me at 623-2307 or by email at ellen_lang@tbaytel.net if you are interested to arrange payment and coordinate pickup. This year there will only be participation prizes so everyone wins!!

The challenge quilts will be displayed as part of the Grand Nations Crossroads Fibre Arts exhibition at the Thunder Bay Museum from July 13 – Sept 17, 2021. **The quilts will be hung on dowels so each quilt will require a hanging sleeve**. The hanging sleeve is basically a tube that is the length of your quilt and will fit your thumb. Both top and bottom of the hanging sleeve will need to be sewn to the top back of the quilt. **You**

also must label your quilt on the back only – not on the front. Your label must include your name.

A few reminders about the challenge:

- 1. Create a wall hanging or quilt that can be hung. The quilt must be quilted & bound.
- 2. Maximum dimensions 36" x 36".
- 3. Must use all 3 challenge fabrics provided in the front of the quilt, not including the binding.
- 4. The 3 challenge fabrics must be prominent in the quilt.
- 5. Participants are encouraged to create an original design.
- 6. Only use 3 additional fabrics to create your original design.
- 7. A hanging sleeve is required on the back to accommodate a dowel. See above for description.
- 8. A label (on the back of the quilt) with your name.
- Deadline for submission has changed to end of May 2021. Drop off location will be announced next month.


