QUILT BEE

We will be planning for a Quilt Bee Event in the winter (January or March).

In the meantime, I'd like to encourage anyone who is interested in practicing their piecing or machine quilting, to contact Adrienne Lopes (alopes@tbaytel.net) to obtain a kit. Kits include fabric and a pattern all ready to assemble. They are beginner friendly and a lot of fun. You will receive all fabric required and the instructions to make the quilt top. We can work together to determine what size you would like to make and what colours you might like to work with.

I have one hospice size kit ready using precuts from the new Accuquilt. It goes together very smoothly and no additional trimming of triangles! If you like red and white quilts, this one is for you. Let me know if you want to work on this kit.

If you are interested in practicing your machine quilting, a good place to practice is on a charity quilt. Adrienne has batting and backing fabrics available and many quilt tops or panels that can be used to practice your machine quilting. Many are lap size – please don't be concerned that they are large. Reach out to Adrienne to discuss sizes and options. So many of our quilt tops are sitting waiting to be quilted so they can be enjoyed by the community.

As plans become possible for the Quilt Bee, Adrienne will reconvene the Quilt Bee Committee to plan the event. If you are interested in volunteering on this committee, please let Adrienne know. Thank you!



Quilt-a-Long

We have designed another Quilt-a-Long and both of us made our quilts with different fabrics to show you the possibilities with this pattern.

Patterns for this quilt will be provided each month to members by email after the meeting.

This quilt along is beginner friendly. You can choose to make the quilt as shown but you have some choices. Corner blocks can be applique, pieced, one of each, or just insert a large square of a feature fabric—maybe that large print you've loved but didn't want to cut up. This is the perfect way to showcase it.

We encourage you to join in the fun!

Pick your fabrics and post your choices on Facebook or send us an email. We'd love to see your plans.

Final Quilt Size is planned to be 58 x 58 inches.

SAMPLE QUILTS FOR THE 2021/2022 QAL



Mary-Catharine's Sample Quilt

This multicolour quilt was created with a collection of scrap fabrics that were chosen based on a colour pallet of pink, green and yellow. Kona snow was chosen for the background.

Mary Catharine chose to make the applique blocks for the corner stone blocks.



Adrienne's Sample Quilt

This sample quilt was created with a selection of fat quarters chosen to match a specific focus fabric (sunflowers). The background is Essex Linen in Charcoal

Adrienne chose to make the pieced blocks for the corner stone blocks.

Greetings,

Like you, we have been busy with making our teddy bear quilts. We were also able to collect 9 bed-sized and 4 nap quilts since the October meeting. Thank you.

If you have any finished Comfort quilts, orphan blocks (minimum 8" square), and/ or 12.5" quilted squares, they can be brought on November 20th for collection at the teddy bear quilt drop off. We hope to be able to include making fidget quilts at a future quilt bee and the orphan blocks can be used in making small fidget quilts, including taggy blankets. We still have some starter materials bagged for anyone interested in making a fidget. Many examples are available on the website and internet. The key consideration is to make them safe for frequent washings and if you have fun with it - others will likely enjoy it too.
