Mary Catharine chose to make the applique blocks for the corner stone blocks.




Adrienne's Sample Quilt

Happy New Year,

Now I can focus on some unfinished projects and work on keeping my resolutions - or some of them.

If you have some extra time, you can try making a figit or two. Checkout pattern suggestions on the internet and the Guild website. There is a high demand for these small activity squares to help relive stress and boredom for seniors experiencing lockdown once again. Let me know if you are in need of some starter materials.

Hopefully we will be able to hold a quilt bee this winter to work on donation quilts of all sizes. In the interim, if you need labels or have finished donation quilts, please let us know and we can organize pickup or drop off arrangements.

Recommended Quilt Sizes	
Neo Natal	36" x 36"
Crib	34 to 36" x 36"
Wheel Chair	36" x 48"
Nap Quilt	40" x 55 - 60"
Bed	63 to 65" x 80"
Dignity	72" x 84"

Please remember that comfort quilts are laundered frequently so check that binding is securely sewn and that you can touch stitching wherever you place your hand on the quilt.

If you would like to join the committee or have suggestions for new facilities in need of comfort quilts, let us know. New members are always welcome and we prioritize where the quilts are taken based on the needs, type of use, and previous donations. Places such as the hospice where quilts benefit multiple users are preferred. Thanks.
