
TEDDY BEAR QUILTS

At the last meeting I mentioned that 173 was the final count, so now I am going to adjust that to 196 since we received 23 more after the meeting. Thanks to all who contributed to this worthy cause.

There seems to be a misconception among the members of the Guild, and I would like to try and clear that up. Apparently, some of the members have mentioned that we had Teddy Bear quilts in storage, so they did not bring one this year. What we have in storage is stuffed animals that the Guild purchased during the pandemic because it was felt that many members didn't get out to shop. I have mentioned many times that the members do not have to bring a stuffed animal but just bring a small quilt and the committee will put a stuffed animal with it.

When we have the Teddy Bear drop-off at the Church in November members of the Committee take the bags home that day and they are distributed to the Community agencies within a few days; so, 196 "Teddy Bears" with quilts went out this year. Everything is technically gone in November, and we start fresh again the following November.



The Joy of Finishing - A toolkit of bindings and binding alternatives

No doubt you have a favourite method of binding your quilts. However, sometimes you may have a different type of project that needs something special — or something simple! Or perhaps you would just like to expand your binding repertoire. This class will cover basics of hand and machine bindings, offer tips, tricks and alternatives, and include information on binding scallops, non-right-angle corners and circles. From there, we will go on to bindings with faux-flange, two colour reversible bindings, faux binding, techniques for facings and more. After you take this class, you can go on to apply the information as you finish your quilt show entries and other UFOs!

Superior Quilts Quilt Show 2023 Update

Save The Dates: Quilt Show is May 26-28. Banquet is Saturday night, May 27.

Quilt show setup and quilt drop off is May 25.

New, for this year only: Usually the submission for quilts allows for any quilt made in the previous 2 years from the show date, because our show has always been every two years. But we haven't had a show since May 2019. So the rule for the 2023 show is that any quilt made since May 1, 2019 (the past 4 years) will be eligible for submission. So, we hope to get lots of quilts. The Intent To Show forms will be available early in the new year.

Guest Quilter/Instructor: We are excited to get Geeky Bobbin from Toronto (Bobbie Gentili). She is a modern quilter who does wonderful work and you can check it out at the here the geeky bobbin – fun fabric creations for the little geek in all of us or go to GeekyBobbin.com. She'll be teaching 3 courses plus a trunk show at the banquet.

The 3 courses are Vortex and Moonrise for the full days and Y-seams for the half day on Sunday. Registration for courses will begin in January. Full write-ups and prices will be in the December Quill.

Vendors: We have commitments from 6 vendors so far. Vicky and Jeannette are still working to get a few more.

Guild Booth: We still need a chair for this sub-committee. But more importantly, we need you to keep making little projects for sale at the booth. The proceeds help fund the Guild's activities throughout the year. The Christmas Craft Share might give you some ideas of things you could make. I'll periodically send out some ideas too. Microwave bowl cozies sold well (Fabricland has Wrap and Zap on sale for \$18 right now). Zippered pouches, fabric baskets, pin cushions, aprons, placemat sets, bags...basically anything you'd like to get. Just no mug wrappers. Also, go through your old quilting books, patterns and magazines and put them aside for the booth. They may be old to you but we have lots of new quilts who might love them. We sold lots of books last time.

Quilt Show Challenge: Start working on those projects. Ellen told me all the kits have been sold and she has \$370 to spend on prizes....so lots to be won.

Demos: Cathy Ridley needs about 10 people to do a demo at the show. If you have some technique to share or a simple project then let her know. We aren't charging for demos this time unless there is a kit you can buy. Some of the demos in the past have been EPP, hand applique with felt, neat tools, hand quilting, etc.

Registration/Deregistration: We still need a few people for this committee.

Remember, the Intent To Show forms to submit your quilts will be going out early in the new year so get those quilts finished or at least decide what you will put in the show. You can list 3 quilts but we sometimes take more if space allows. Don't worry if you haven't volunteered for anything on the organizing committee. There are plenty of jobs to do at the quilt show: You can sell merchandise in the Guild booth, sit at the admission table, be a 'white glove' lady and wander through the quilts answering questions and showing people the quilts, help hang the quilts, just to name a few. Linda Boulter and Cathy Britt will have sign up sheets for these jobs in the spring.



SUPERIOR QUILTS 2023 CHALLENGE

RUBY ANNIVERSARY



In 2021 the Thunder Bay Quilters' Guild celebrated our 40th anniversary which is considered our 'ruby' anniversary. For the 2023 Superior Quilt challenge the committee has decided to celebrate this achievement. Guess what colour the fabric is!

Once again Northcott Fabrics has graciously provided 3 bolts of fabric for our challenge. Each bolt has been divided into fat quarters and fat eighths and are now available for purchase.

There is a limited amount of fat quarters and fat eighths available. It will be sold on a first come, first serve basis. Fat quarters can be purchased for \$10 and fat eights for \$5. Payment for the challenge fabric will be cash only. The fabric bundles will be available for purchase at any library night, Vickers Heights sew days and any social that the Guild has. For out of town members please contact Ellen Lang for mailing options.

More details to follow but here are some highlights:

- 1. Create a wall hanging or quilt that can be hung. The quilt must be quilted & bound.
- 2. Maximum dimensions 36" x 36".
- 3. Must use all 3 challenge fabrics provided in the front of the quilt, not including the binding.
- 4. The 3 challenge fabrics must be prominent in the quilt.
- 5. Participants are encouraged to create an original design.
- 6. Only use 3 additional fabrics to create your original design.

Deadline for submission is April 17, 2023.

Looking forward to seeing your creations
