
TEDDY BEAR QUILTS




SUPERIOR QUILTS 2023 CHALLENGE RUBY ANNIVERSAY



- Quilt backing options and techniques
- Intermediate free motion quilting

If you are interested in teaching a workshop, please let me know. We provide our instructors with an honorarium for their teaching time.

Additionally, if you have workshop ideas that you would be interested in, please let me know. In past years we have offered pattern classes (pick a quilt pattern and have a workshop for that pattern) - that is another option if there is interest.

I'd be happy to brainstorm some ideas if you'd like to discuss. It has been great to have in person workshops this year. There is always something to learn.

When I took over as show coordinator 1 ½ years ago I wasn't sure we'd even be able to pull it off because of Covid restrictions. But we did it and it was great! There will be a short survey going out but if you have any suggestions or comments for the 2025 committee, please let me know.

Many thanks to all those who were part of the 2023 quilt show and to all those who attended, volunteered, shopped at the vendors, ate at the café, took classes, took part in some demos and made stuff for the Guild booth and donated or obtained door prizes for the banquet and participation prizes (to be announced at the June meeting). Thanks to all of you who shared on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram. The show display went up in record time (just over 2 hours) and came down in about 20 minutes! So, kudos to the display/hanging committee.

As I walked around the show floor, I had so many people come up to me and say what a great show it was and what a great time they were having. It was wonderful to finally get to celebrate in person after waiting 4 years. I told them all that I didn't do it alone and had many people to thank for the success of the show. So well done everyone; remember 2025 planning starts in September or October.

I went over my banquet speech several times and thought I had everything, but there was 1 person that I meant to thank at the banquet that I didn't. Jackie Black was the person who went through all the old photos and Guild history after I used them for my Looking Back articles. She strung them up on the banners and made the posters. It was fun to look back....the Guild has come a long way since 1981. Thanks so much Jackie.

I spoke to a number of people from other guilds from as far away as BC and they asked about our community projects, especially the teddy bears and fidgets. Many were going to take those ideas back to their members.

Total Entries: 157 quilts, 27 challenge quilts plus a lot of comfort quilts, teddy bear quilts, fidgets and placemats around the building. We also had the demo booth with 12 amazing demos, hospitality booth, Diane Connelly showing what to do with selvages, and the sewing area.

Attendance: Friday 442, Saturday 465 and Sunday 231. Plus, at any time there were at least 50-70 additional non-paid attendance from my committee, class attendees and volunteers. We had 2-3 busloads from the cruise ship that was docked that weekend and I believe 1 busload from a senior residence.

Banquet: From what everyone has said they thoroughly enjoyed the evening. The food and service were excellent. We had lots of door prizes. We had 99 attending the banquet and 5 for the trunk show. Bobbie Gentili's (Geeky Bobbin) trunk show was great.

I presented Jackie Black and Joanne Brimmell with a gift and flowers to honor their being founding members. I didn't know at the time that they go way back to high school friends. It's nice to know we still have some members going strong after 42 years.

Tracy from the Valhalla said she's never had people phone her and tell her how impressed they were with an event, so thanks to those of you who called her. By the time you're reading this you will have received an

email from Luci explaining that anyone who paid for a banquet ticket was eligible for a \$10 refund (or you could donate it to the quilt bee). When Luci and I met with Tracy around Christmas she gave us the 2022 price list and said it would be 20% higher for 2023. So, we went based our tickets on what would've been the new price....to our surprise we got charged the 2022 rates, so we passed on the savings to you.

Classes:

Even though the classes didn't fill up, I think everyone enjoyed them and learned something. I was in 2 and hope to have a Vortex and Moonrise ready for show & tell in Sept. Let's see if everyone can have their project done for then too. Maybe a few of you have finished for this month.

Guild Booth:

Thanks to the efforts of 29 members, we had lots of things in the booth for sale. There were also tons of books and magazines and a lot of them sold. The Guild booth made \$2,150.50.







